Utah's Need for Child Care

March 2020

When Utahn's decide to start a family, they face tough financial tradeoff decisions. Utahn's start families at a much younger age than other states with careers at a young stage. This is why for many families it is more cost effective for a parent to leave the workforce than to pay for child care. For most families in Utah, the parent that chooses to stay home is the mother.²

However, households increasingly need two incomes to afford the cost of living with near stagnant wage growth,³ and the rising cost of housing,⁴ education and tuition debt,⁵ raising children,⁶ and healthcare.⁷

Offering child care solutions would support all those who want to contribute to Utah's economy.

SNAPSHOT: Labor Force Participation of Utah Parents

52% of children under 6 have all available parents in the workforce. (This includes single parents, where it is more than twice as likely to be a single mother than father.)⁸

Utah Mothers Work

60% of working mothers have a child under 6 **73%** have children between 6-17

These numbers show that mothers return to work when their children go to school. Would they have stayed in the workforce if they had access to affordable, quality child care?

NEED: Parents Want to Work More

30% of Utah parents have had to cut back on work hours because of unmet child care needs.⁹

44% of Utah mothers surveyed said they would utilize child care to work more or pursue their education.¹⁰

AFFORDABILITY: Child Care Costs in Utah

Child care that costs more than 7% of a family's income is unaffordable:

- Single parents in Utah pay 34% of their income for infant care, and 60% for two children.
- Married parents pay 12% of their income on child care.
- **63%** of Utahns can't afford child care, where infant care is 53% more expensive than college tuition. ¹²

ACCESSIBILITY: Utah ranks last in the nation for accessibility to child care. There are 4 children that need care for every open child care slot.

Economic losses from absences and turnover due to child care breakdowns in other states:

State	Tax Revenue Lost	Economic Activity Lost
Louisiana ¹³	\$117 million	\$1.1 billion
Maryland ¹⁴	\$84 million	\$1.3 billion
Georgia ¹⁵	\$105 million	\$1.8 billion

Luckily in Utah, there is a workforce gap that needs to be filled. 16

Opportunity:

- Government covers 39% of the cost of child care.
- Parents shoulder 60%.
- Businesses currently cover 1%, yet can benefit from the workforce child care creates.¹⁷

A lack of child care costs businesses money:

- U.S. businesses lose \$4.4 billion annually due to employee absenteeism as the result of childcare breakdowns.
- U.S. businesses lose \$4 billion annually due to loss of productivity as the result of childcare breakdowns. 18
